

Chaplain's Chat

At any time in a Shrine-Mason's life, the importance of prayer is introduced. Before entering upon any important undertaking, event, or a new day or at any time, it is proper to invoke the blessings of God. Prayer is a conversation with the Supreme Architect of the Universe. Prayer takes many forms, illumination, supplication, repentance, intercessory, praise, adoration, gratitude, blessing, etc. In congregate settings, prayer is usually led by a minister, chaplain or a designated person. The Revised Standard Version of the Bible mentions prayer no less than 46 instances and pray 67 times. It is important to remember that prayer is the ineffable gift to us from God.

In Pre-Reformation times, prayer was usually reserved for designated clergy only. This was probably because in the time period before the Reformation, the world was enduring the 'Dark Ages'. This is usually considered to be the time between the fall of the Roman Empire, around 500 AD until about 1000 AD, or some say until the Reformation period. During this time period it

was fashionable to 'know nothing' and the only educated persons were the clergy. Prayer, then, obviously was only for the educated and certainly not for the common folk. Things changed radically with the Reformation. The early reformers, Luther, Zwingli, Calvin, Fenner, Knox and others thought that anyone should be able to 'talk with God.'

Today, in the midst of COVID-19, we hear many references to prayer. Unfortunately, many persons view prayer as a prescription item only to be used in time of spiritual or physical sickness or in a time of dire need.

In Paul's letter to the Colossians, Chapter 4, verse 2, he says, 'Continue steadfastly in prayer, ... pray for us also ...' In his first letter to the Thessalonians, Chapter 5, verses 16 and 17, we read, 'Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances: ...' In the letter of James, Chapter 5, verse 16 we read 'The prayer of a righteous man has great power in its effects.'

Prayer is an important factor, or should be, in the life of every Shrine-Mason. Intercessory prayer(s) is the prayer for another person or persons, adoration prayers are prayers of adoring the Supreme Architect of the Universe, prayers of supplication are prayers asking for something, prayers of thanksgiving or gratitude are prayers of thanks for the many, many blessings which we all receive day after day. The bottom line is that prayer need not be eloquent or silver tongued, just sincere.

News from Shriners Children's Ohio

This news is coming from the latest Shriners Children's Ohio. This is the official name of the new Shrine Hospital located in the Dayton Children's Hospital, 2 West. The Shrine Hospital opened and admitted its first patient on February 22nd. The physical move of equipment and furnishings was completed during the last week-end of January during the snow storm. It is interesting (and refreshing) to note that 61% of the current (Cincinnati) employees moved to the new hospital. The original estimate was that about 30% would make the move. There are currently, as of January, 89 full-time and 55 part-time employees. Patient census was down, as could be expected, for January with an intake of 41 (from 7 different states).

A robust marketing and communication campaign is underway in the Dayton and surrounding market areas. The campaign is a cooperative effort between Shriners and the Dayton Children's Hospital Marketing Team. The website in January had 15,542 users with 1,800 from Columbus, 1,401 from Cincinnati and 909 from the Dayton area. 10,602 users had no location available.

Our hospital representative, Debbie Harrell, is again beginning to get out in the field making very informative presentations about the hospital and gathering referrals. If you would like to schedule Debbie, contact one of your reps. The new hospital is available for patients and we, as Shriners, have a job of finding children who can use our help.

Donations seem to be doing very well with 9.5% of the \$3,125,000.00 target met to date. Naming rights are available for Shrine Temples, clubs, units and individuals.

A moment of silence was observed in memory of the late Bob Lazenby who was a long-time Aladdin representative of this board.

The next meeting of the board is scheduled as an 'in person' meeting which will be held at the Antioch Shrine in Dayton. This will be the first time in a year for a face to face board meeting.

Making Gains with Speech Therapy

Speech and language problems make it hard for a child to succeed in school. A child may have trouble understanding, following directions or answering questions. Language problems make reading and writing harder. Children who have trouble talking with peers have difficulty making friends. These challenges are all barriers to education. But speech language pathologists can help.

Speech therapists at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Erie work with each patient to find a form of communication that helps them succeed across all settings. "Success is different for every patient and family, depending on their goals and what they wish to get out of therapy," said Bridget Muldowney, speech language pathologist at the hospital. "Ultimately, we want to find functional communication, which could be using first words, understanding language, using a communication device, etc. We determine which manner of functional communication works best, depending on the child's challenges and goals."

For Audrey, success came shortly after beginning therapy. "Before starting therapy, Audrey could not communicate what she wanted or needed," said her mom, Lily. "She would have temper tantrums and other behavioral issues." After learning ways to communicate both verbally and nonverbally, Audrey is "basically a different kid," Lily added. "We have now given her tools to limit her frustration and allow her to succeed. She is so much happier."

Liam is another patient who found the tools to succeed through speech therapy. "Speech therapy has given him more independence," said his mom, Stacey. "It's truly given him a voice." Liam is nonverbal and uses an eye-gaze device to help communicate his needs, likes and dislikes. Although he may not speak, he can now greet friends, pick what song to listen to or tell someone if he is hungry or thirsty.

"We help kids reach their highest potential by targeting specific areas for growth," added Nicole Lewis, speech language pathologist at the Erie hospital. "We have to determine what kind of support they need to reach their highest potential both socially and academically."

Sold! After sitting empty since March of 2017, the old hospital was sold and closed on in January of 2021. Easter Seals of Kentucky bought the property and plan to move their Cardinal Hill Rehabilitation operations there. This should serve them well in the future.

Lexington Shriners Medical Center is glad to have a unique partner in our donor development department. Our Director of Philanthropy, Dale Wallenius, put together a group of over 45 business people and they are known as Corporate Council. They continually raise money for our medical center. Since 2015, they have given our Lexington Medical Center over \$1 million dollars, including funding a physician fellowship position last year. The Corporate Council funded our newest physician, Dr. Leeth, from March until December at a cost of \$150,000. Once the Imperial board saw how this helped speed up wait times, they agreed to add her to our staff budget. These members meet quarterly with our administration to see how they may be able to help improve our care and support Lexington's 16,000 patients.

This special partnership between our medical center and business leaders is unique in the Shrine healthcare system. It has fostered healthcare excellence in Lexington through the philanthropic support of the business community. Look for more on what our Corporate Council does in the future.

Special thanks to Dan Carpico, fellow Lexington board member, who secured a donation of a pickup truck load of specialty orthopedic braces and equipment from a local retiring orthopedic physician.

Thanks also to Cindy Kinney and the ladies of LOS Thea Court #5 for sewing two bags of blankets for our patients and two bags of stuffed toys. The kids always enjoy getting these after a surgical procedure.

First Lady Kim's Project

Family Services at Shriners Children's Ohio Located in Dayton, Ohio



In the past, the Cincinnati Shriners Hospital for Children had family unit space within the facility to house families and their children while receiving care. Since the hospital relocated to Dayton, families will need to be housed at nearby hotels. Eventually, they will be able to utilize the Ronald McDonald House across the street from the hospital. However, a major facility upgrade is planned for the House to increase the 14 rooms to 60 rooms. Until the renovation is completed (likely in 3-5 years), Shriners will utilize area hotels for families to stay close to the hospital and their children. This is a substantial expense, with each day costing approximately \$125 per family. 


