Chaplain's Chat

In the August 2020 Special Report, a supplement to the Mayo Clinic Health Letter, the entire publication was entitled Psychological First Aid. The article was about resiliency in times of stress. No one could argue that 2020 did not offer its rather healthy share of stress.

Stress may be divided into two categories, eustress also known as 'good' stress which sounds like an oxymoron or a contradiction in terms of distress. (Eustress in not listed in Taber's Cyclopedic Medical Dictionary or in the Bantam Medical Dictionary.) Eustress, or 'good' stress, is the one which gets us up in the morning, the stress related to ambition and to achieve success in endeavors. It could be called a 'driving force' while the other stress, distress, is the one which gives us trouble. This includes anxiety, fear, grief, sadness, sleep problems, upset stomach, worry, headache, fatigue plus others, this sounds like the side effects in TV medical ads! Fortunately, as mentioned above, humans are resilient which means humans have the ability to return to

normal function and/or form. What to do???? Focus on what you can control, e.g., maintain healthy habits, stay connected, manage your thoughts, practice relaxation and meditation techniques.

The concordance of the Revised Standard Version of the Bible does not note stress, as such, but does mention a related term, strife. Elihu, the young man who challenges Job, in the 33rd Chapter, Verse 19 talks about ... 'continual strife (stress?) in his bones.' Job certainly had his share of stress and strife! The Supreme Architect eventually rewarded Job handsomely. Job, Chapter 42, verse 10, 'And the Lord restored the fortunes of Job... gave Job twice as much as he had before.' In the 18th Psalm of David, verse 43, ...'Thou didst deliver me from strife...' Strife is mentioned many times in the Bible. The Supreme Architect deals with stress and we need to look at stress knowing that He is our protector and sustainer. John 14, verse 1, says 'Let not your hearts be troubled, believe in God,...'

News from Shriners Children's Ohio

We bring you greetings from Shriners Children's Ohio, yes, that is the official name of your new hospital located within the walls of the Dayton Children's Hospital. The new hospital is in operation, the first day being a clinic on February 22. The first surgery was performed on February 24 and, as could be expected, patient encounters to date are down

A vigorous marketing and advertising campaign using many modalities is underway. Our outreach workers are gradually re-entering the field. Donations are somewhat down with only about 18% of the goal for the year 2021 being met at this time. The good news in this area is the number of new donors being reached and responding, is almost 1,000 newbies to date. This number was aided by a \$1,000.00 donation by the Aladdin Senior Shriners.

Much more information was shared at the March board meeting. It was the first face-to-face meeting of the (Ohio) Board of Governors in eleven months. The meeting was held at the Antioch Shrine Center as the hospital is still observing COVID-19 precautions.

The usual round of committee meetings preceded the formal board meeting. Following a fantastic lunch provided by the caterer at Antioch, the full board convened in the ballroom of the Antioch Shrine Center. In-person attendance was excellent and the call-in option was available and used.

The formal ribbon cutting ceremony was observed via Facebook on March 19. Imperial Sirs, Jim Smith and Jerry Gantt, were both (physically) in attendance. It appears that 1,000s tuned in for the ceremony.

Your hospital is using Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, YouTube, radio, television, billboards, search engines, websites, etc. to get the word out mainly in the Dayton area about the hospital.

The Human Relations department is still very seriously looking for nurses, the employment market is EXTREMELY tight. A very surprising bit of information, the hospital thought that maybe 30% (+/-) of the Cincinnati employees would follow the change to Dayton. In actuality, about 60% of the employees followed the hospital to Dayton. As of February 28, there were 85 full-time employees and 46 part-timers.

The April board meeting was a combined board meeting and a retreat on April 27 and 28.

Provost Unit

The May, 2020 Provost stated meeting was the second consecutive monthly meeting cancelled by Governor's restrictions due to COVID-19 last year. Director Bob Warner conducted the meeting and graciously welcomed everyone to our second Provost stated meeting this year. all donated from the Circleville Police Department to the Dayton Childrens Hospital.

Transportation, the Paddy Wagon and the Provost trailer were discussed at the meeting. Director Warner appointed a four-person committee to investigate options to replace the Paddy Wagon and trailer. Anyone with thoughts or ideas regarding the Paddy Wagon and trailer should contact Past Director Rob Hartsell, Bill Smith, Joey Brooks or Rod Basye.

More details were brought to light regarding the year's most important fundraising activity, the Memorial Tournament scheduled June 1-6 with May 31 as set up day. This is the last year Nationwide will be the main sponsor. Workday, Inc. will be the main sponsor beginning in 2022. Pre-tournament events including the Fore Miler Run are still being planned. The Memorial Tournament is one of the best opportunities for Provost members to earn points toward an Imperial stipend and discount on meals. All Provost members can earn 5 points for each day worked during the Memorial Tournament week. The work schedule depends on whether patron attendance at this event will be allowed. Stay tuned as this event develops in terms of scope of Provost detail.

Other upcoming scheduled events include the annual stag fishing trip to Lake Erie scheduled for May 23-24 and Zoofari scheduled Saturday, August 28. Due to COVID-19, only the Divan will attend Imperial scheduled July 4-8



In the past, the Cincinnati Shriners Hospital for Children had family unit space within the facility to house families and their children while receiving care. Since the hospital relocated to Dayton, families will need to be housed at nearby hotels. Eventually, they will be able to utilize the Ronald McDonald House across the street from the hospital. However, a major facility upgrade is planned for the House to increase the 14 rooms to 60 rooms. Until the renovation is completed (likely in 3-5 years), Shriners will utilize area hotels for families to stay close to the hospital and their children. This is a substantial expense, with each day costing approximately \$125 per family. Additionally, the Family Services program will provide coupons for meals in the cafeteria, transportation to/from hotels, basic amenities, (toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, shaving kits, etc.) and other living essentials.


